Transportation

4. Director of Technology: Mr. Taylor submitted the following report:

Technology Director Report

July 13, 2010

STAA Application

Attached to this report you will find the application for a School Technology Advancement Account Loan. We feel that utilizing this low cost loan that would be repaid from the debt service fund is an excellent opportunity to make some of our normal CPF purchases in 2012 that would free up some funding to use for other projects in CPF.

Summer Projects Progress

We are continuing to work on various projects and implementations in preparation for the new school year including:

- ❖ We are in the process of transitioning to our new web hosting service. Our training is scheduled for July 25th.
- ❖ We have started the install of three new classroom projectors and cabling for the remodeled area being used by KASEC.
- ❖ Efforts are underway to install an additional 19 video security cameras.
- I am continuing to get acquainted in working with our new Skyward program. We are in the process of getting our data exports configured to be able to export data to School Messenger (our automated calling program), Destiny (Library Management), Comalex (Food Service), and VersaTrans (transportation).
- All state reports due by July 1st were completed and signed off. I am hoping to finish the suspension expulsion report as soon as data is verified by the buildings.
- Our first grade will be using the Discovery Education Techbook and I will be submitting teacher and student data for their online accounts to use with their curriculum.
- ❖ Some of our Lead Teacher equipment has arrived and we have been busy getting acquainted with our first set of iPads along with a tablet PC and a student response system.
- Bill has been working on IP phone configurations and installing wireless access points to expand our wireless network. We will have a good portion of the high school covered with wireless along with most of our public areas and classrooms with wireless tablets.
- ❖ The fiber that was damaged in the Intermediate building has been replaced with an armored fiber that will prevent similar damage in the future.

Skyward Steering Committee

I have been invited to be a member of the Indiana Skyward Steering Committee. This group is responsible for determining priorities for submission of program enhancements specifically for Indiana schools.

Dick Taylor, Technology Director

Mr. Taylor also asked for the Board's approval to apply for the School Technology Advancement Account Loan. Mr. Kenworthy so moved, seconded by Mr. Davidson. The motion passed 7-0.

5. Superintendent: Mr. McCracken submitted the following report:

KASEC Update

- Cheryl Harshman, KASEC Director and Suzie Reagle, Assistant Director are here and working on putting together class lists and interviewing KASEC staff. Their support staff, Carol Graf, Melanie Courtney and Pat Cunningham will start as follows:
 - o Carol Graf July 18, 2011
 - o Melanie Courtney July 20, 2011
 - o Pat Cunningham July 25, 2011
- We are still in the process of finalizing a separation agreement with Kokomo.
- Interviews for KASEC staff began on July 13. Recommendations for several positions will be made tonight under personnel.
- Life Skills Classrooms Construction on Western's three Life Skills classrooms are well underway. We anticipate all being completed by the end of July. Two of the three classrooms at Eastern did not need any renovation. The high school classroom needed minor modifications to allow for access to an adjoining restroom. The restroom will be remodeled to accommodate the needs of those we serve. We will plan an open house prior to the start of the school year so parents can see the facilities.
- Procedural Audit Attached is a procedural audit that was conducted by the Indiana
 Department of Education. The audit included items specific to Western as well as the previous
 LEA. As we move forward as the LEA, compliance will become our responsibility under the
 direction of Cheryl Harshman.

2. Extra-Curricular Account Information/Update

Recently there have been many questions regarding the management of extra-curricular funds and rumors of missing funds. I would like to thank the newspapers for their help on clearing up these issues. As they printed in the papers, no one did anything illegal. The concerns were procedural and we are now taking steps to make sure all ECA accounts follow proper procedures. The issue that arose concerned inside accounts (school ECA accounts) and outside accounts. We are seeking clarification from the State Board of Accounts on this issue and plan to have clear procedures in place by the start of the school year.

3. Four Community Partnership – Dr. O'Rourke was active in the 4 Community Partners and Big Table in Howard County. Through the efforts of the partnership and the housing authority, tutoring was made available to students in Pine Valley.

As a result of the 2010 United Way campaign, 4 Community Partners has grant money available for two specific projects in Howard County, Pine Valley being one. The grant is looking for community partners to bring resources together, apply for the grant and provide services to these two communities. Area 5 has contacted Western to participate with them and other organizations in this partnership. My thought for Western's role is to provide the link between the school and tutoring, and possible reading instruction to the more than 42 students that live in Pine Valley that attend Western. I will keep you updated as we move forward.
